### LINOLEUM AS ART

From last October until last month, nearly 2,000 square feet of boldly patterned, custom-designed linoleum flooring was on display at the Smithsonian's Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden in Washington, DC., as part of an exhibition featuring the work of Juan Munoz, a contemporary Spanish artist who reinvigorated sculpture in the late 1980s. Munoz, who died last year at 48, often created room-size environments and stagelike settings populated by anonymous figures. Two works in the exhibit. *The Wasteland* (shown) and *The Prompter*, included sharply patterned Armstrong floors as an integral part of the artwork. 877/276-7876. Armstrong, Lancaster, Pa. CIRCLE 215
